Is Good Friday the same as Passover?

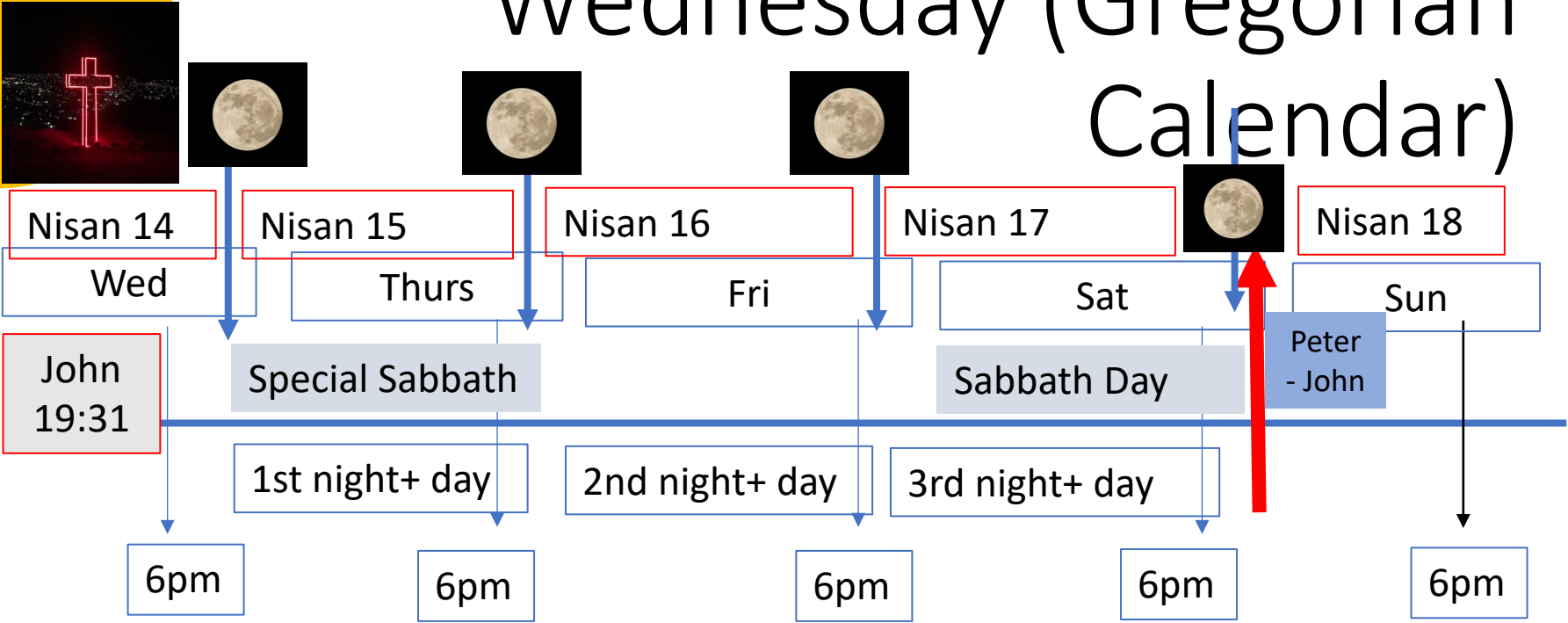
- Was Yeshua crucified on Good Friday?

	On the tenth of this month every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of his father, a lamb for a household. Exodus 12:3		The Last Supper was on the eve of Passover, not the Passover itself (John 13:1-2). In John 13:21-29, Jesus predicted His own betrayal by Judas, and His other disciples thought that Judas was going to buy things for the Feast of Passover. So Jesus was eating not the Passover Meal but the Passover Preparation Dinner.		Now you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight. Exodus 12:6	For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the great fish, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. Matthew 12:40		The Feast of Firstfruits is the day after the Sabbath (Lev 23:10-15). Jesus was resurrected at the dawning of the first day after the Sabbath. That was the beginning of the first day of the week, not the morning dawn (Matthew 28:1). Mary Magdalene waited till the Sabbath was over, and she went to the tomb immediately after Saturday 6 pm. She was the first to see the Risen LORD (Mark 16:9-11). The body of Jesus was reported to be stolen or missing in the night and not in the morning (Matthew 28:11-15).		

Yeshua was crucified on a Wednesday (Gregorian Calendar)

Passover in the Old Testament

The Israelites were slaves in Egypt...400 years – Gen 15:12-14

Exodus 12:1-6 – The Month of Nisan

- **12** Now the LORD spoke to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying, ² “This month *shall be* your beginning of months; it *shall be the first month of the year to you*. ³ Speak to all the congregation of Israel, saying: ‘On the ***tenth of this month*** every man shall take for himself a lamb, according to the house of *his* father, a lamb for a household. ⁴ And if the household is too small for the lamb, let him and his neighbor next to his house take *it* according to the number of the persons; according to each man’s need you shall make your count for the lamb. ⁵ ***Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male*** of the first year. You may take *it* from the sheep or from the goats. ⁶ Now you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of the same month. Then the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it at twilight.

- ¹² **For** *I will pass through* the land of Egypt on that night, and will *strike all the firstborn* in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: ***I am the LORD.***¹³ Now the blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you *are*. And when I see *the blood*, I will *pass over* you; and the plague shall not be on you to destroy *you* when I strike the land of Egypt.

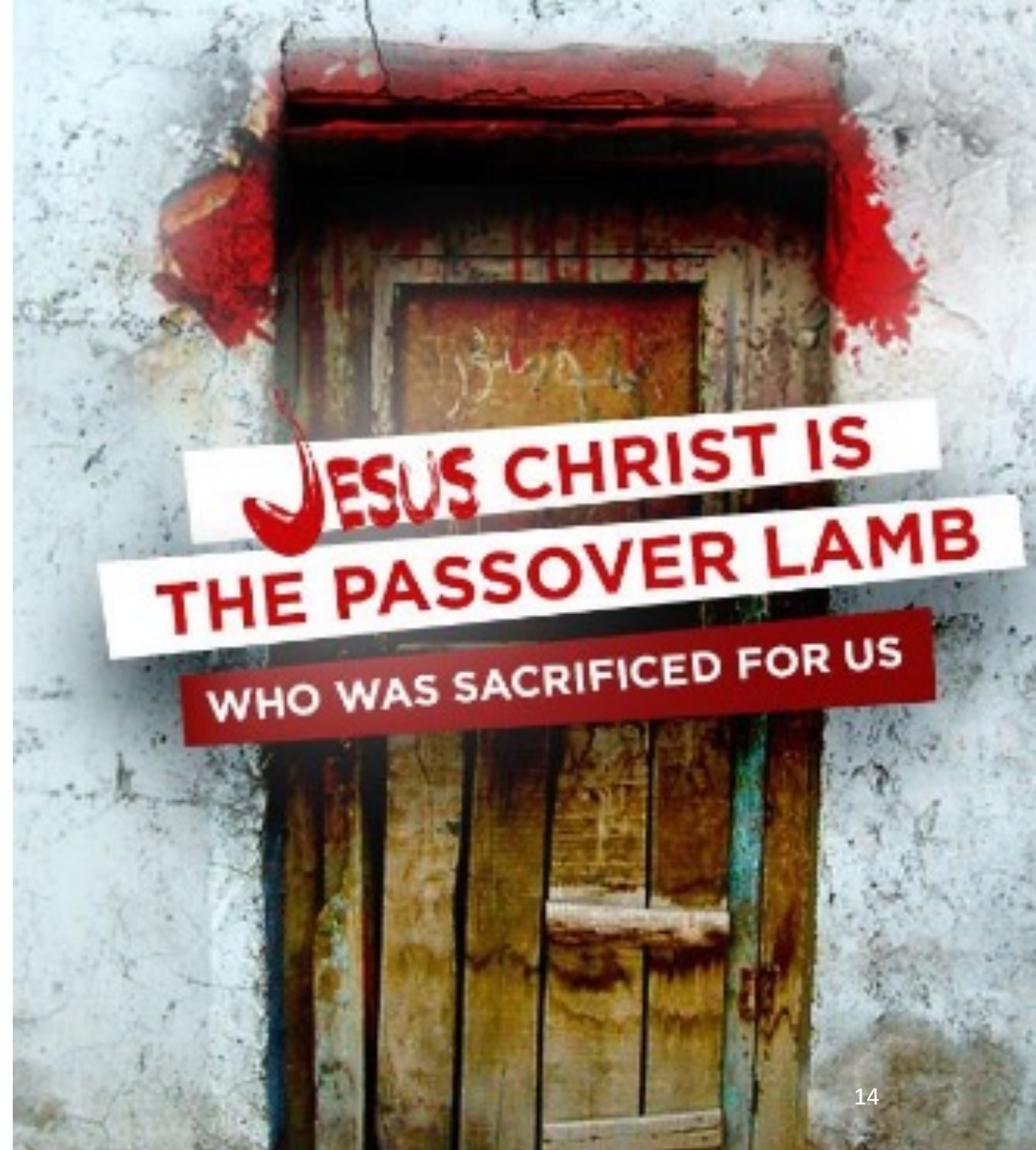
Significance of the Passover – Eternal Life

- This Event is a reminder of God's deliverance of the Israelite from Slavery in Egypt
- Those who received Yeshua as their Passover Lamb and as their Personal SAVIOR will have eternal LIFE
- There is No Second Death!
- John 3:16 – “¹⁶ For God so loved the world that ***He gave His only begotten Son***, that whoever believes in Him ***should not perish but have everlasting life.***”

Isaiah 53:4-6

- Surely He has borne our griefs
And carried our sorrows;
Yet we esteemed Him stricken,
Smitten by God, and afflicted.
⁵ But He *was* wounded for our
transgressions,
He was bruised for our iniquities;
The chastisement for our peace was upon
Him.
And by His stripes we are healed.
⁶ All we like sheep have gone astray;
We have turned, every one, to his own way;
And the LORD has laid on Him the iniquity of
us all.

¹⁴ When *the hour had come*, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. ¹⁵ Then He said to them, "With *fervent* desire I have desired **to eat this Passover** with you before I suffer; ¹⁶ for I say to you, I will no longer **eat** of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God."

¹⁷ Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, "Take this and divide *it* among yourselves; ¹⁸ for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes."

¹⁹ And He took bread, gave thanks and broke *it*, and gave *it* to them, saying, "This is *My body which is given for you*; do this in remembrance of Me."

²⁰ Likewise He also *took* the cup after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you."




Yeshua - the Passover Lamb

- John 1:29 ²⁹ The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, “**Behold! The Lamb of God** who takes away the sin of the world!
- John 11:50-52 “⁵⁰ nor do you consider that it is expedient for us that one man should die for the people, and not that the whole nation should perish.” ⁵¹ Now this he did not say on his own *authority*; but being high priest that year he prophesied that **Jesus would die for the nation**, ⁵² and not for that nation only, but also that He would gather together in one the children of God who were scattered abroad.”

Passover As a
Prophecy
Fulfilled-
Genesis 3:15

- Ps 41:9 “Even my own familiar friend in whom I trusted,
Who ate my bread,
Has lifted up *his* heel against me.”
- Mark 14:10-11 “¹⁰ Then Judas Iscariot, one of the twelve, went to the chief priests to betray Him to them. ¹¹ And when they heard *it*, they were glad, and promised to give him money. So he sought how he might conveniently betray Him.

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Isa 50:6 “I gave My back to those who struck *Me*,
And My cheeks to those who plucked out the beard;
I did not hide My face from shame and spitting.
- Matt 27:26-30 “Then he released Barabbas to them; and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered *Him* to be crucified.
- **The Soldiers Mock Jesus**
- ²⁷ Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole garrison around Him. ²⁸ And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe on Him. ²⁹ When they had twisted a crown of thorns, they put *it* on His head, and a reed in His right hand. And they bowed the knee before Him and mocked Him, saying, “Hail, King of the Jews!” ³⁰ Then they spat on Him, and took the reed and struck Him on the head.”

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Isa 53:7 “He was oppressed and He was afflicted,
Yet He opened not His mouth;
He was led as a lamb to the slaughter,
And as a sheep before its shearers is silent,
So He opened not His mouth.”
- Matt 27:13-14 “¹³ Then Pilate said to Him, “Do You not hear how many things they testify against You?” ¹⁴ But He answered him not one word, so that the governor marvelled greatly.”

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Psalm 22:8 ““He trusted in the LORD, let Him rescue Him; Let Him deliver Him, since He delights in Him!”
- Matt 27:43-44 “⁴³ He trusted in God; let Him deliver Him now if He will have Him; for He said, ‘I am the Son of God.’ ” ⁴⁴ Even the robbers who were crucified with Him reviled Him with the same thing.”#21

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Isaiah 53:12b “And He bore the sin of many,
And *made intercession* for the transgressors.”
- Luke 23:34 “³⁴ Then Jesus said, “*Father, forgive them*, for they do not know what they do.” And they divided His garments and cast lots.

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Psalm 22:1 “My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me? *Why are You so far from helping Me, And from the words of My groaning?”*
- Matt 27:46 “⁴⁶ And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, “Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani?” that is, “*My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?*”
- Luke 23:46 “⁴⁶ And when Jesus had cried out with a loud voice, He said, “Father, ‘into Your hands I commit My spirit.’ ” Having said this, He breathed His last.”

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Zechariah 12:10 “¹⁰ “And I will pour on the house of David and on the inhabitants of Jerusalem the Spirit of grace and supplication; then *they will look on Me whom they pierced*. Yes, they will mourn for Him as one mourns for *his only son*, and grieve for Him as one grieves for a firstborn.”
- John 19:34,37 “³⁴ But one of the soldiers pierced His side with a spear, and immediately blood and water came out. ³⁷ And again another Scripture says, “*They shall look on Him whom they pierced.*”
- Psalm 22:31 “They will come and declare His righteousness to a people who will be born, That He has done *this.*”

Passover As a Prophecy Fulfilled

- Isa 53:8-9 “⁸ He was taken from prison and from judgment, And who will declare His generation? For He was cut off from the land of the living; For the transgressions of My **people He was stricken.**
⁹ And they made His grave with the wicked— But *with the rich at His death,* Because He had done no violence, Nor *was any deceit in His mouth.*
- Matt 27:57-60 “⁵⁷ Now when evening had come, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who himself had also become a disciple of Jesus. ⁵⁸ This man went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be given to him. ⁵⁹ When Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth, ⁶⁰ and laid it in *his new tomb which he had hewn out of the rock*; and he rolled a large stone against the door of the tomb, and departed.”

Removing the Cob-Web

- Yeshua **was not crucified** on Good Friday but at Passover – The First Feast of the LORD
- Holy Communion **is not an Event** in the Bible BUT we are taught to commune with a Holy God 24/7 all the days of our life
- We are Commanded to Celebrate the **LORD's Supper** as often as we can in remembrance of HIM
- Yeshua is our **Passover Lamb**
- This redemption Event-Thread runs from Genesis to Revelation
