

Hebraic Year 5785

- Last Year was the Year of Open Door "4 Dalet"
- This is the Decade of Proclamation "80"
- This Year is 5785 Double Grace "5"
- "7" represents Completion
- "8" represents New Beginning
- What does this Hebraic Year 5785 tell us prophetically?
 - Double GRACE
 - Mighty Movement of the Holy Spirit
 - The Decade of Proclaiming the soon Return of Yeshua, our High Priest, Prophet and King



The Menorah

- The Feasts of the LORD
- The first four Feasts in Spring have been fulfilled in Yeshua's Death, Resurrection, and the Indwelling of the Holy Spirit
- The Feast of Trumpets is in the Biblical Seventh month
- Seven is a completion number
- The last three Feast in the Fall will see the establishment and the completion of the Kingdom of God – Revelation 11:15




The Feast of Atonement - Leviticus 23:26-32

²⁶ And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying: ²⁷ "Also the *tenth day* of this seventh month shall be the Day of Atonement. It shall be a holy convocation for you; you shall afflict your souls, and offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. ²⁸ And you shall do no work on that same day, for it is the Day of Atonement, to make atonement for you before the LORD your God. ²⁹ For any person who is not afflicted in soul on that same day shall be cut off from his people. 30 And any person who does any work on that same day, that person I will destroy from among his people. ³¹ You shall do no manner of work; it shall be a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings. 32 It shall be to you a sabbath of solemn rest, and you shall afflict your souls; on the ninth day of the month at evening, from evening to evening, you shall celebrate your sabbath."

Feast of Atonement – An Entire Chapter 16 of Leviticus

- Why there was a need for this Feast be covered in one entire Chapter 16
 - There are Seven chapters devoted to atonement of sins in the Book of Leviticus (Chapters 1-7)
 - Unintentional sins
- Intentional sins covered in Chapter 16
- The Feast of Trumpets to the Feast of Atonement
 - 10 Days of Reflection- 10 Days of Awe
 - Teshuvah (Repentance 40 days of reading Scripture in reflection and repentance)
 - Jonah proclaimed destruction to the people of Nineveh in 40 days – Jonah 3:4






In the Days of the Tabernacle of Moses




The Feast of Atonement – Chapter 16

- The High Priest removed his regular garments
- 2. Washed himself in the layer
- 3. Enter the Holy Place
- 4. Put on special linen garments Lev 16:4





Yom Kippur (2024)



Leviticus 16:6,11,12-14

- 5. The High Priest goes out to sacrifice a bull at the altar of *burnt offering* for himself and the other priests Lev 16:6
- 6. He then entered the Holy of Holies for the first time with some of the bull's blood, along with incense and coals from the altar. The smoke from the burning incense hid the Ark of the Covenant from view as he sprinkled the blood seven times on and in front of the Mercy Seat covering the Ark and the Holy Place Lev 16:12-14

Sin Offering

- 7. He then went outside the Tabernacle and cast lots for two goats to see which one was to be sacrificed. A scarlet ribbon was tied to each goat's horn Lev 16:7-8
- 8. At the altar, he killed the goat as a sin offering for the people and, for a second time, entered the Holy of Holies to sprinkle the blood in front of and on the Mercy Seat Lev 16:15-16





Sprinkling of blood of the bull and goat


9. He then went outside to the altar of burnt offering and sprinkled seven times —with the blood of the bull for himself and the blood of the goat for the people – Lev 16:18-19

The Scapegoat

- 10. While in the courtyard, he laid both hands on the second goat, thus symbolizing the transfer of Israel's sin, and sent it away into the wilderness Lev 16:20-22
- 11. The high priest then entered the Holy Place, removed his special garments, bathed, and put on his regular, ornate garments Lev 16:23-24
- 12. As a final sacrifice, he offered a ram for himself and another ram for the people (burnt offering) Lev 16:24



The law is only a shadow of the good things that are coming—not the realities themselves. For this reason it can never, by the same sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, make perfect those who draw near to worship. ² Otherwise, would they not have stopped being offered? For the worshipers would have been cleansed once for all, and would no longer have felt guilty for their sins. ³ But those sacrifices are an annual reminder of sins. 4 It is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. – Hebrews 10:1-3



From the Second Temple Era-Talmudic Influence

- The priests tie a scarlet thread on the horn of the two goats
- The scarlet thread on the Scapegoat turned white as it was taken out to the wilderness
- The scarlet thread from the sacrificed goat hung on the temple door turned white
- However, forty years before the destruction of the Temple in AD 70, the scarlet thread remained red
- Why?





Yom Kippur Today

- After the destruction of the Second Temple
- No Temple No sacrifices
- Yohanan ben Zakkai, a first-century Jewish leader declared that God no longer desired blood sacrifices, replaced by:
 - Repentance
 - Charity and good work
 - Prayer
- Yom Kippur transformed into a day of introspection, prayer and fasting
- Fasting from sundown like in the days of Jonah (Nineveh)

Yeshua Atones for our Sins — *In the Future*

For Christ did not enter a holy place made with hands, a mere copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us; ²⁵ nor was it that He would offer Himself often, as the high priest enters the holy place year by year with blood that is not his own. ²⁶ Otherwise, He would have needed to suffer often since the foundation of the world; but now once at the consummation of the ages He has been manifested to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself. 27 And inasmuch as it is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment, ²⁸ so *Christ* also, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time for salvation without reference to sin, to those who eagerly await Him.

-Hebrew 9:24-28



What Does Hebrews 9:24-28 mean?

Our Salvation is *a progression*

We will be *saved when the final Atonement* for our sins is made in Heaven by our Lord Yeshua

- We are first, Justified Romans 10:9
- We are then, Sanctified Ephesians 4:11-32
- We are finally, Glorified Colossians 3:4

What Are the Signs for the Final Atonement to take place in Heaven?

- 1. The Current war in the Middle East will usher in a period of unprecedented Peace Ezekiel 38:11
- 2. God again use the Persian (Iran) to build the Third Temple
- 3. The Abrahamic Accord will enlarge to include Saudi Arabia and other Arab-Muslim nations Genesis 25:9
- 4. Temple Mount will be the site for worship by the 3 Monotheistic Faith Revelation 11:1-2





Daniel 9:27 — Seventieth Week

- 5. The 70th Week Prophecy by Daniel 9:27
 - a) A Covenant with many will be made
 - b) Temple built with a wall around it Ezekiel 42:20
 - c) Shekinah Glory appears in the Temple Ezekiel 43:1-7
 - d) Fullest of the Gentile has come in Romans 11:25
 - e) God will send a "strong delusion" 2 Thessalonians 2:11
 - f) All Israel (Messianic Israel) will be saved Romans 11:26, Zechariah 12:10
 - g) Messianic Israel (Woman of Rev 12) will be supernaturally protected for 3 ½ years or Time, Times and half a Time Revelation 12:14
 - h) Anti-Christ will be revealed and stop the sacrifices and persecute the saints– Daniel 9:27 & Revelation 13:5-7
 - i) The Overcomers during the Great Tribulations Revelation 12:11



6. The Bride will be in Heaven – Revelation 19:6-9


Yeshua will open the Seventh Seal and atone the Sin of His Bride and those who believe in Him
